

SOUTH DAKOTA VOTERS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS

**KNOW YOUR
RIGHTS**

You CAN vote if you're experiencing homelessness, here's how:

First, make sure you're registered to vote in South Dakota. To register to vote you must identify a place of residence on your voter registration form.

- Your place of residence if in Minnehaha County can be 101 N. Indiana Ave, Sioux Falls, SD 57103 which is the Bishop Dudley House.
- Your mailing address can be 900 E. 8th St., Sioux Falls, SD 57103 which is the Banquet.
- If you live outside of Minnehaha County, email us at southdakota@aclu.org.
- Find a voter registration form at aclusd.org/south-dakota-votes.
- Confirm your registration at aclusd.org/voterstatus.

Other requirements to register to vote in South Dakota:

- Be a United States citizen.
- Reside in South Dakota.
- Be at least 18 years old on or before the next election.
- Not currently serving a sentence for a felony conviction which included imprisonment, served or suspended, in an adult penitentiary system.
- Not be judged mentally incompetent by a court of law.

Vote absentee or vote early. Visit your county courthouse where you're registered to vote in and cast your ballot early.

- Find where to vote absentee by visiting aclusd.org/voter-location.
- Request an absentee ballot by sending in your absentee ballot application. Download an application at aclusd.org/south-dakota-votes.

Vote on Election Day. To vote on Election Day, which is Nov. 3, 2020, go to the polling place you're assigned to and cast your ballot.

- Find that location at aclusd.org/polling-place.

MORE INFORMATION

Voter I.D. Requirements. If you have a photo I.D. with you on Election Day, show that to the precinct worker. If you do not have a photo I.D. on Election Day, you can sign an affidavit swearing that you are who you are, and you will be given a ballot by the precinct worker.

Voting if you have a criminal record. You must register to vote again after you complete your sentence.

- **You can vote if:**
 - You have been sentenced only to pay a fine, fee, or restitution.
 - You have been charged with a crime but not convicted.
 - You have received a suspended imposition of a sentence or have been sentenced to only pay a fine, fee, or restitution.
- **You cannot vote if:**
 - You were convicted of a felony and are currently serving a sentence of imprisonment, including parole and probation.
